Our 21st Year

The celebrations for Jigsaw4u's 20th Anniversary continued into this year — an extraordinary achievement for a charity in challenging financial times. Jigsaw4u has always kept true to its original purpose of giving children and young people a voice in the decisions that affect their lives and 'helping them to put the pieces back together'.

There were a range of celebrations to mark Jigsaw4u's 20th year ranging from volunteer parties, to service user Easter Egg hunts and a reception for commissioners and supporters held at the House of Lords kindly hosted by Lord Clive Brooke of Alverthorpe.

With the great reduction in funding from Local Authorities and Central Government, fundraising and applications for grants and contracts continue to be a challenge. There is growing competition from large national charities and private companies for Local Authority contracts. This drives the need to fundraise and ensure and demonstrate the good work and effectiveness of what we do.

We continue to see a much needed increase in financial support from local and some larger businesses. We are extremely grateful for their amazing generosity.

I am delighted to be presenting this review as my first year as Chair of Jigsaw4u. I started as a volunteer advocate in 2013 and was immediately struck by the quiet and fierce passion of all of those involved in Jigsaw4u. I subsequently became a Trustee in January 2016 and Vice-Chair of the Jigsaw4u Trustees in September 2017.







Did you know?

1 in 10 children have a diagnosable mental health disorder - that's roughly 3 children in every classroom.

Almost 1 in 4 children and young people show some evidence of mental ill health (including anxiety and depression)

3 in 4 children with a diagnosable mental health condition do not get access to the support that they need (Young Minds)

Jigsaw4u can help!

- **WE CAN HELP** by seeing children and young people as soon as any sign of distress is noted. This is called early intervention.
- **WE CAN HELP** by using our skilled team to work with children and young people so that they can have their worries identified and get the support they need.
- **WE CAN HELP** by providing children and young people with strategies to enhance their resilience and equip them to deal with their worries.
- WE CAN HELP children and young people communicate their worries with their parents and carers.

This year has seen Jigsaw4u deliver a service to

over 3700 children, young people and their families.

5134 individual sessions were delivered

1557 children went to a lunchtime a drop in session at their school

409 children attended a group

704 consultations were provided to parents, carers and professionals.

We dealt with 454 enquiries

233 services users were known to Children's Social Care

We attended **400 meetings** relating to our service users

20th Anniversary Celebration at The House of Lords





On November 14th we celebrated 20 years of supporting children and young people with a very special event at the House of Lords.

We were kindly invited by Lord Brooke of Alverthorpe to hold the celebration in the beautiful River Room overlooking the river Thames and London skyline.

Friends, supporters, staff, trustees and service users came together to reflect on and celebrate the amazing work that is provided by Jigsaw4u year after year.

We began the evening with a special message from the Mayor of London, Sadiq Khan who said; 'What you do makes a huge difference to children and families at some of the toughest time imaginable. You have been there, and continue to be there for some of the most vulnerable people in our society. I can think of no higher calling than that, helping children come to terms with difficult situations and start to move forward with their lives.'

Our guest speaker Sir Keith Ajegbo, Chair of Trustees at the Stephen Lawrence Charitable Trust, spoke of the invaluable extra support provided to vulnerable young people by charities like Jigsaw4u that can make a difference between coping and succeeding, or being overwhelmed by their situation. He acknowledged the challenges charities are facing in the current funding climate due to local authority cuts, which makes life increasingly difficult for many families and yet the needs in our communities are growing. Sir Keith praised the work of our volunteers, particularly highlighting our mentoring project and described Jigsaw4u as a 'wonderful' and 'very, very necessary' charity.





Brothers Aaron and Darren introduced our film 'Talking to children about death', and then confidently answered some questions from our guests about their experiences of working with Jigsaw4u. When asked 'what advice might you give to a young person who was nervous about coming to Jigsaw4u for the first time' Darren said, 'there's not anything to be nervous about as everyone is nice and they help you express your emotions'. Aaron and Darren accessed support through our bereavement project after their Dad died suddenly in 2016 as the result of a brain haemorrhage.

Christmas joy at Connect House

In the run up to Christmas last year, we were approached by a company based on the Willow Lane industrial estate in Mitcham who wanted to donate Christmas presents to the families living temporarily in Connect House. Set Square Staging donated £3,000 from which Jigsaw4u staff bought children's toys, games, adult toiletries and food gift sets for the families. Staff at Close Brothers Group in Wimbledon bought 50 gifts which were also donated.



We worked alongside Assetgrove who manage Connect House and were able to invite residents to come and choose some presents one afternoon. We decorated the Assetgrove office like a Santa's grotto and the Rotary Club of Morden sent along their very own Father Christmas to help give out the presents.

The event was a great success with many of the families sharing they were extremely touched by the kindness of everyone involved.



Jigsaw4u wins Charity Governance Award

We were delighted to win the award for 'Improving Impact' (staff 4-25) at this years Charity Governance awards held at the Clothworkers' Hall, London. The Charity Governance Awards are organised by the Clothworkers Company – a City Livery company that supports trusteeship initiatives. The evening brought together charities large and small with each winner receiving £5,000 of unrestricted funds.

The 'Improving Impact' award is for organisations that can demonstrate how the board has contributed towards the increase of the charity's impact in relation to its cause, mission and values. The judges were looking for examples of increasing social impact, not just fundraising or increasing income.



The Merton Partnership Volunteers Awards took place in June, and Kathleen Zonfrillo was given a 'Gold Award' for her volunteering. She has been a dedicated volunteer with us since 2016 and has volunteered on our domestic abuse and advocacy projects.
